Nudge Me At The Edges is a series of intimate choreographic moments between three dancers and a camera that explores physical touch from the myopic point of view of the dancer. Blending in and out of the audience crowd, the dancers mingle together and apart while a live feed camera captures their bodies in motion. The dance and the camera projection create a split view that is only seen by the eyes of audience members who happen to be in close proximity, leaving the experience of the happening up to chance.

The film's choreographer Isabelle Sjahsam made her professional debut at a CalArts Digital Arts Expo in 2003 while the film's costume designer Stacy Ellen Rich has worked with numerous CalArts Alumni and Faculty. The film first premiered at OutFest in 2021 and has screened at the SF Transgender Film Festival, Translations, Denton Black Film Festival and elsewhere.
